The Mother Colony of the West Indies

Also known as Sugar City, St. Kitts has been known for its rich culture and its loving people. From the Indigenous peoples, to Sir Thomas Warner, from Slavery to Independence, this country has all the wonderful delights of a true cultural melting pot.

It was first inhabited by the Arawaks, a peaceful Amerindian tribe that originated from the Orinoco Valley in South America. After constant conflict with the another tribe, St. Kitts ended up in the hands of the Caribs. They reigned on the island then known as Liamuiga, “fertile land”, in the Amerindian language. Their reign however was only for a time.

In 1493, the country was visited by Christopher Columbus on his second voyage. He named the island Saint Christopher in his honour and sailed on to Hispaniola (presently called Haiti and The Dominican Republic). The Caribs appeared to be a friendly sort although his meeting with them did not last as long as the Spanish settlements as they saw no precious ores on the island.

In 1623, Sir Thomas Warner, a sea merchant saw the island in passing, visualizing its richness and hoping to set up a successful tobacco colony, went back to Britain to request permission to settle there with other British colonists and supplies. In 1624, he colonized the island in the name of Britain. He was then joined by the French in 1625 who, under Pierre D’Esnambuc, occupied the north and southern ends of the islands leaving Britain in the middle. They coexisted for sometime with the Caribs who became suspicious of their European colonists. The Caribs plotted a massacre which was relayed to Sir Thomas

Warner by a Carib woman named Barbe. The planned massacre ended unsuccessful as a result of the British and the French joining forces to attack the Caribs. As a result, over 2,000 Carib Indians were massacred at Bloody Point in 1626.

The British and French had another conflict amongst themselves over the ownership of the island. In 1713, however, the French were expelled from the island. However, the tobacco crops continued to exist. During the eighteenth century, the Sugar revolution came about. St. Kitts now had another cash crop to keep up the rich colonial society that existed from the coming of the Europeans.

The Sugar revolution saw a change in the demography and population as smaller tobacco plots were joined together to create large sugar plantations. Today, remnants can be found throughout the islands as remainders of old sugar mills and plantation houses. The Colony now thrived on the monoculture of sugar hence the introduction of Slavery.

The first slaves in the Caribbean were the Amerindians. However, the colonists introduced serfs or Bondservants to the colonies. The bondservants were unprofitable as they were more concerned with drinking spirits and occupying land. They turned to Africa and so the slave trade began. Tribes such as the Ashanti, Igbos, Popos and Ibibos from the Savannah and Forest Empires of West Africa were brought here under dangerous conditions to work.



National Symbols



St. Kitts and Nevis' Official National Wear reflects the true "Caribbeaness" of its people. A combination of African and European influences which have shaped the history of St. Kitts and Nevis is evident in both the male and female outfits.

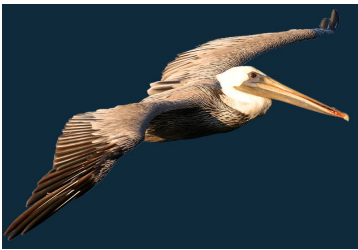
Men's Wear

A straw hat trimmed with madras offered protection from the hot day's sun. The short sleeved, V-neck jack shirt trimmed with madras is made from off-white cotton. The design is similar to traditional shirts worn by Africans. The beige cotton, ankle length pant is a reflection of the local fabrics that were commonly used during the colonial period.

Women's Wear

It is customary for African women to wrap their heads for protection. The main dress is off-white cotton, with a corset top and an ankle length, wide flare petticoat bottom. The beige cotton sleeves are short and puffed by using the drawstring. A short lap skirt made from crocus is worn over the main dress to protect it from dirt. The madras "Cane Soda Wrap", which was used to carry soda while fertilizing sugar cane, is draped around the waist. The crocus drawstring bag was a safe way for women to secure their money.

The national bird of St. Kitts and Nevis is the brown peli-



can, *Pelecanus Occidentalis*. In its youth, it is brown on the head, neck and upper parts of the body, and mostly white below. As it matures, the majority of the body becomes dark brown while the upper part of the head turns white.

National Symbols



The national flag of St. Kitts and Nevis was adopted on September 19th, 1983. It was designed by Edrice Lewis in a national design competition. Green represents our fertile lands. Red represents our struggle from slavery through colonialism to independence. Yellow represents our year-round sunshine. Black represents our African Heritage. The white stars are symbols of hope and liberty.



The centre of the coat of arms is dominated by a shield at the base of which is a lighter in full sail. The lighter is one of the traditional means of transportation. A red chevron is highlighted by two Poinciana flowers. At the top of the shield on the blue background is the head of a Carib, supported by the fleur de lis and a rose. The fleur de lis and rose signify the French and English influences. A helmet topped with the battlements of a tower appears with a flaming torch upheld by the hands of an African, European, and a person of mixed descent. The torch signifies the struggle and quest for freedom by a people of diverse ethnic origins, but united in purpose. The shield is supported on either side by pelicans with wings extended, displaying a sugar cane plant and the coconut palm tree, which are extensively cultivated throughout St. Kitts and Nevis.



The national flower is the Poinciana or flamboyant, named after Monsieur de Poincy, the first French Governor of St. Kitts, who is said to have introduced it to the region. Its scientific name is *Delonix Regia* and it is said to have originated in Madagascar. yellow scalloped flowers followed by long, black seedpods. It blooms from May to August
