The certificate shall remain valid only under the compliance with the following:

This Annex is issued for any land where mass vegetative clearing has occurred, and where the clearing is beyond the footprint of the intended works identified in the Certificate of Environmental Clearance (CEC). Compliance with the CEC is therefore conditional on the developer/owner undertaking replanting/reforestation of the impacted land, with coverage between 5% - 10% of the total land area. Therefore, replanting is to occur using the native plant species from the list of plants identified below (native fruit trees are also acceptable):
